

MEMORIAL LIBRARY MEETING ROOM

April 14,2026

Minutes of the regular monthly meeting of Shinglehouse Borough Council held in the Municipal Building meeting room on April 14,2026.

Council present: Pres. Barry Church, Mr. Resig. Ms. Mckean,, Mr.Perrin , Mr.Milliken Mayor McKean, and Mr. Donovan and also Andrew Bean.

Meeting was called to order by Pres. Church. Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag was said. Motion by Mr.Resig seconded by Ms. McKean to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. Unanimously carried.

Guests: Mrs. Nancy Ayers and Mr. Dennis Ayers. Mrs. Ayers addressed concerns with speed on Academy Street, curbs on Academy Street being a safety hazard. Council advised the curbs on state road are PennDOT's responsibility. Penndot did look at them summer 2025 advised they were up to code. Borough secretary will submit a complaint in again on PennDOT's website. Chief Buchholz stated Academy Street is a state road and explained the legality for local police for pulling people over in the borough on a state road for speed. Chief Buchholz did agree speed is an issue on Academy Street. Mrs. Ayers addressed the noise ordinance. Chief Buchholz stated we need a meter to measure the noise on vehicles. Chief Buchholz and secretary will look into small speed signs to measure speed and prices. Mr. Ayers questioned what Chief Buchholz does all day inquiring how can he hold more than one employment. Mr. Ayers feels the community isn't being protected. Council stated Mr. Buchholz is salary 44 hours per week. His hours are varied and handles several issues and calls all hours. Mr. Buchholz does give a monthly report at the council meetings. Council advised it is not illegal for any employee to have more than one type of employment.

Public Works Report: Andrew Bean reported Hydro vac is up and running. Two major water leaks were repaired in the borough. Community service help went well. Two road plates have been ordered from GFS. Will try to install new water valves when things slow down. Will need to purchase a weight box for the new tractor. WWTP upgrade been going well. Lot of piping has been done. Equipment has still been delayed from Zylum. Project lost two productive months this winter due to weather.

for vac truck repairs from Tarrytown in the amount of \$4,589.00.OSVML got awarded \$39,000.00 from the Norton grant for new roof on building and sidewalk repairs next to the library.

Committee Reports: Mr. Milliken reminded council about different grant funding.

Unfinished Business: Jenny Clark asked to have until August to repair her water lines and do property cleanup. Council stated they would like everything done by June 2026. Her water leak is affecting the running of the borough wells.

New Business: Motion was made by Mr. Milliken and seconded by Mr. Perrin to approve Pennvest Payment request No.12 for funding in the amount of \$14,812.00 and includes HRG fees only. Unanimously carried. Mr. Church abstained. Motion was made by Mr.Milliken and seconded by Mr. Perrin to approve Pennvest payment request No.12 in the amount of \$116,764.36 includes Pennvest related interests costs and construction costs. Unanimously carried. Mr. Church abstained. Motion was made by Mr. Donovan and seconded by Ms. Mckean to approve pay app No.01 for W.C. Eshnaur &Son, Inc. HVAC in the amount of \$40,035.91. Pay app No. 08 for H&K GC in the amount of \$27,477.00, pay app No. 03 for Dave Kronewetter EC in the amount of \$49,221.30. Unanimously carried. Mr. Barry Church abstained.

Motion was made by Mr. Donovan and seconded by Ms. McKean to adjourn the meeting at 8:44 PM. Unanimously carried.
